

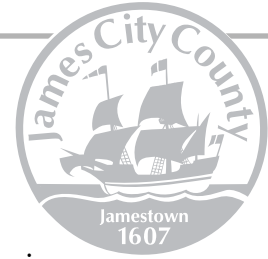

2002 Fall Leaf Collection

General Information

Bagged leaves will be collected in three cycles during November, December, and January by voting districts. Please refer to **voting districts** for your zone and corresponding collection dates. This is the only leaf collection provided by the County. Bagged leaves can also be self-hauled to the Jolly Pond Convenience Center during operating hours (*one coupon per four lawn and leaf-sized bags is required.*) For more information, call the Recycling Coordinator at 565-4000, or visit our website at www.jccEgov.com.



General Rules

1. Bagged leaves must be left curbside by 8 a.m. on the first day of collection in your zone. Leaves set out after the first day may not be collected until the following cycle or can be self-hauled to the Jolly Pond Convenience Center (coupons required.) Each street in your zone will be collected once during your scheduled week.
2. Bags should be no larger than lawn and leaf-size bags (40 gallons or less.) There is no limit to the number of bags you can set out. Bulky materials such as brush and tree limbs CANNOT be accepted.
3. Burning of leaves is not permitted in James City County, except in certain areas zoned A-1, General Agriculture.
4. Bagged leaves are available for commercial or residential composting. If interested, call the Recycling Coordinator at 565-4000.

Special Supplement for James City County Citizens **2002 Voting Information**

Election Day is Tuesday, November 5. Voters will elect members of the U.S. Senate and the 1st District House of Representatives, vote on two Constitutional Amendments, two proposed Bond issues, and one Regional Referendum.



Important Dates:

October 7, 5 p.m. -
The last date to register or to change an address.

October 31, 5 p.m. -
The last date to request an application for a mailed absentee ballot.

November 2, 5 p.m. -
The last date to vote absentee in person.

November 5, 5 p.m. -
The last date for mailed ballots to be received at Voter Registrar's Office.

Additional hours for absentee voting are Saturdays, **October 26 and November 2** from 9 a.m.- 5 p.m.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments:

1. "Shall the Constitution of Virginia be amended to permit the Supreme Court to consider, as part of its original jurisdiction, claims of actual innocence presented by convicted felons in the cases and manner provided by the General Assembly?"
2. "Shall the Constitution of Virginia be amended to allow localities by ordinance, rather than the General Assembly by law, to exempt property from taxation that is used for charitable and certain other purposes, subject to the restrictions and conditions provided by general law?"

Proposed Bond Issues:

1. "Shall Chapters 827 and 859, Acts of the General Assembly of 2002, authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the maximum amount of \$900,488,645 pursuant to Article X, Section 9(b) of the Constitution of Virginia for capital projects for educational facilities, take effect?"
2. "Shall Chapters 854 and 884, Acts of the General Assembly of 2002, authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the maximum amount of \$119,040,000 pursuant to Article X, Section 9(b) of the Constitution of Virginia for capital projects for parks and recreational facilities, take effect?"

Regional Referendum:

"Shall an additional sales and use tax of one percent be imposed in Isle of Wight County, James City County, York County, the City of Chesapeake, the City of Hampton, the City of Newport News, the City of Norfolk, the City of Poquoson, the City of Portsmouth, the City of Suffolk, the City of Virginia Beach, and the City of Williamsburg, with the revenues to be used solely for regional transportation projects and programs as specified in Chapter 853 of the Acts of Assembly of 2002?"

The polls are open from 6 a.m. - 7 p.m. Voters are required to show identification (ID) before casting their ballots. Accepted forms of ID include: Virginia Voter Identification Card, employer issued photo ID, Military ID, Federal, State, or Local issued ID, Virginia Driver's License, or a Social Security Card. Any voter without proper ID may still vote by signing an Affirmation of Identity under oath.

Absentee ballots are available to qualified voters unable to vote at their polling place on Election Day. Call the Voter Registrar's Office to request an application to vote by mail, 253-6868.
