## JCSA proposes rate changes

The Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority (JCSA) will hold a Public Hearing on April 10, at 7 p.m., at the County Government Complex, 101 Mounts Bay Road, in the Building F Board Room, James City County, Virginia, to consider the following proposed rate changes as a means of helping finance the future water supply related to the King William Reservoir.

1. Increase the Water System Facilities Charge:
  - A. Residential 5/8 inch meter – the current fee is \$300 per bathroom fixture and is proposed to go to \$500 per bathroom fixture.
  - B. Mixed use structures such as apartments, townhouses, timeshares, and residential condominium projects:
    - (1) Individually meter each unit – the current fee is \$300 per bathroom fixture and is proposed to go to \$500 per bathroom fixture
    - (2) Meter each building in multi-building projects – the current fee is \$300 per bathroom fixture and is proposed to go to \$500 per bathroom fixture
    - or
    - (3) Master meter the entire project – the current fee is \$225 per bathroom fixture and is proposed to go to \$350 per bathroom fixture
2. Establish a new Lawn Irrigation Connection Fee of \$1,400. This fee will be paid prior to issuance of a Lawn Irrigation Permit by the County Code Compliance Office.

Proposed rates apply only to JCSA customers. Proposed rates do not apply to private wells and customers of Newport News Waterworks. All proposed rates and fees governing water service utilities are proposed to be implemented July 1, 2007. The above proposed fees will not apply if building plans are submitted to County Codes Compliance Office by June 30, 2007.

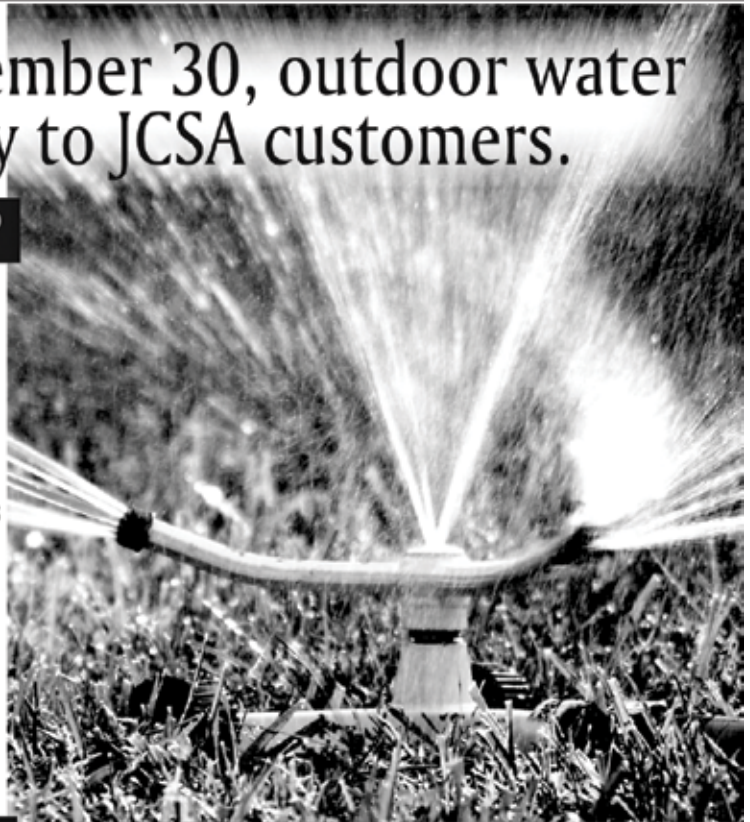

From May 1 to September 30, outdoor water regulations apply to JCSA customers.

### What Does This Mean?

- JCSA customers may use water outdoors for any purpose, at any time, on any day, as long as it is with a container or with a hose with an automatic shutoff nozzle. The hose must be attended at all times.
- Any other method of outdoor water use, such as irrigation systems, sprinklers, or hoses without automatic shutoff nozzles, must follow the Outdoor Water Use Schedule.
- Outdoor water use is not permitted between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., or at any time on Mondays. Penalties will apply.

### New Turf Exemption

- New Turf can be watered for 60 consecutive days from installation. Exemption requests must be submitted to the JCSA in writing or online at [www.jccEgov.com/jcsa](http://www.jccEgov.com/jcsa).

### Caution

- Aerating, seeding, over seeding or top dressing of existing turf does not qualify for an exemption.
- The 60 day new turf exemption does not include a monetary credit on water bills.
