



DEPARTMENT: Community Services/WAMAC/Olde Towne Medical Center

NATURE OF WORK:

Provides supervision of the delivery of pre-natal health care and related services to patients. Ensures that services delivered are in compliance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations and that services are delivered within the context of applicable standards of professional practice in the local community, State, and country at large.

Assists the Clinical Director and the Medical Director in the development and implementation of programs, procedures, and policies for the Pre-Natal Program at Old Towne Medical Center.

The OB Physician reports to the Medical Director and the Clinical Director.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS OF THE JOB:

Assists with the development and implementation of protocols.

Acts as a consultant to the nurse practitioners, physicians, and clinic staff as appropriate.

Conducts pre-natal physical exams and patient assessments, establishes treatment plans, orders appropriate diagnostic tests, and prescribes appropriate medication within parameters of established and approved formulary, as defined by the State Board of Medicine as well as the Scope of Practice as defined by national professional groups.

Performs work safely in accordance with departmental safety procedures and the County Safety Program. Operates equipment safely and reports any unsafe work condition or practice to supervisor.

Performs other duties as required.

JOB LOCATION AND EQUIPMENT OPERATED:

Duties are performed at the Olde Towne Medical Center in a primary care medical clinic setting. Operates general office equipment including computer.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of public health clinical care principles and practices, and wellness concepts.

Good diagnostic skills.

Ability to collaborate with multiple paid and volunteer full- and part-time provider staff from a variety of disciplines, projects, and external agencies.

Ability to plan and supervise the work of others.

Ability to work under pressure in a fast paced clinic setting.

Ability to work and communicate effectively with persons of various multicultural and socioeconomic backgrounds.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Must be a Virginia Licensed and Board Certified OB Physician with Virginia prescriptive authority.

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
